Bach was to do a century later in his *B Minor Mass*, Monteverdi assembled many mature compositions toward the end of his life into one massive volume. *Selva morale e spirituale* – the moral and spiritual wood. Unlike Monteverdi's Vespers of 1610, which sees performances yearly in nearly every major metropolitan area, the gems in *Selva morale et spiritual* are virtually unknown: and yet, they rival his earlier composition in virtuosity, invention, and beauty.
